# FIELD TRIP REPORT PEMBERTON 28 – 30 SEPTEMBER by MARY HARRIS

Christine's order of a fine weekend was delivered & we enjoyed the sunny weekend. Twenty-three people gathered for the Saturday meeting time & we were pleased to welcome Frank & Bev Simmonds from Queensland, and Hans, Gerlind & Rildeger Kohlmuller from Germany for the day.

Our first stop was on Orchid Rd near Northcliffe where large numbers of *Drakea* glyptodon were found. *T macrophylla &* flexuosa were still in bud.

Lunch was at the Hollow Butt picnic site, which was a pleasant spot. Pt aff nana (karri snail) & Cyrtostylis huegelii were here, with Corybas recurvus in seed.

Richardson Rd was the last stop of the day. We stopped at 2 places and orchids found were: - *Pt vittata*, aff *nana* pg 345 & aff *barbata* pg 382 (bloated bird).

Caladenia flava, latifolia & some beautiful hybrids between them.

Cyanicula sericea.

Paracaleana nigrita.

Drakea glyptodon & thynniphila.

Elythranthera brunonis.

Cyrtostylis huegelii.

Thelymitra benthamiana in bud.

Cyrtostylis ovata leaves.

Sunday was a 4WD day, so car-pooling was organized to fill the vehicles available. Many thanks to Christine, Ian, David & Mike who shared their 4x4s. We had an excellent day down Fish Creek Track, which was an unknown area to most of us. We made several stops and orchids listed are the day's tally. Caladenia latifolia, flava, gardneri, interjacens & bicalliata ssp bicalliata. Drakea glyptodon & thynniphila. Paracaleana nigrita.

Pterostylis aff nana pg 345, aff nana undescribed with medium clubbed ears & small rosette, barbata & aff turfosa pg 376. Diuris longifolia & amplissima.

Thelymitra pauciflora, antennifera, with flexuosa in bud.

Fladen ale I

Elythranthera brunonis in bud.

Leptoceras menziesii leaves.

Corybas in seed.

Microtis leaves.

Cyrtostylis huegelii in seed.

We saw huge numbers of Caladenia latifolia & a wide range of colour variations on C gardneri, which were also in good numbers. A dozen of us topped a good day with a meal at the Chinese Restaurant in Pemberton, which was slow in coming (1 hour), nevertheless, an excellent meal.

Information Bay from where we headed north about 20 km to an area of bush on the roadside. Here we found: Caladenia christineae, macrostylis & flava.
Cyanicula sericea.
Diuris amplissima.
Pterostylis vittata & recurva.
Thelymitra antennifera and another in bud.

Monday saw us all at the Manjimup

Elythranthera brunonis in bud.
Further north at the Seaton Ross Rd swamp we donned our wellies and found orchids in the water. One species of Caladenia we found created considerable discussion, was it uliginosa ssp candicans or not? Very similar to but perhaps not quite christineae. (I have been advised that C uliginosa ssp patulens, a pure white variety, grows here. Ed.). Also here was a Pt aff nana with slightly clubbed long ears. T antennifera was identified! Also found flowering were C reptans & flava, M obicularis & T crinita in bud.
From here we all went our own ways, most

returning to Perth, the others going back to Pemberton for another night. All in all, a good weekend. Thankyou Christine.

# TRIP REPORT by ROSS & MARGARET FOX

On Monday when the group broke up after the Seaton Ross swamp Matz led some of us to Press Rd, about 5 km south of Bridgetown. Here we found C vulgata, macrostylis, flava. nana ssp nana, reptans & cairnsiana; Cyrtostylis huegelii; Diuris magnifica & longifolia; Pt vittata, recurva & aff nana just finishing or in seed; and T sp in bud. We were told about C viridescens & rhomboidiformis at Meelup so we set out on Thursday to look for them. We only found several plants of C viridescens, some eaten and some in seed. We also found C flava & Elv brunonis. We then did a quick trip to a location Bill Burton introduced us to in Wilyabrup Rd. We found lots of Caladenias in bud, finally finding a flower of C infundibularis, a first sighting of this specie for us. We also saw C flava; Ely brunonis; Diuris corymbosa, amplissima & aff amplissima & T sp in bud. Driving back along Caves Rd we saw C rhomboidiformis on the road verge. Our next stop was near Coley Rd where we saw many species of spider orchids. As it was too late to take photos we repaired to Yallingup Caravan Park for the night. Next morning we found lots of Diuris aff amplissima, C flava, latifolia, georgei, huegelii & gardneri & Pt recurva in the vicinity of the park.

Back at the Coley Rd site we found L serratus; D amplissima, aff amplissima & corymbosa; C flava, excelsa, chapmanii, georgei, huegelii, ferruginea, procera & longicauda ssp merrittii.

Our last stop was the Augusta Yacht Club where we found C flava & macrostylis, M atrata & T antennifera.

# FIELD TRIP TO CHEYENNE BEACH OCTOBER 12/13 by NOEL CLARKE

This trip was arranged hastily when I heard that C granitora had been seen in bud. Six stalwarts met at a convenient spot at Albany Hwy & Hurley Rd. This has been a favourite stopping place whenever I go down Albany Hwy, a good coffee break spot that usually yields some orchids. Here we found C falcata, flava, magniclavata, reptans & Drakonorchis barbarossa.

We proceeded to Robinson Rd, Woodanilling where we found C falcata, flava, uliginosa ssp uliginosa; Drakonorchis barbarossa & E emarginata.

The next stop was at Tunny where we had no success looking for C luteola. However we did find C chapmanii, longicauda ssp eminens & longicauda, flava; D laxiflora; E emarginata; T antennifera; & hybrids C longicauda ssp eminens x C polychroma and x luteola. Just north of Tenterden we found C flava, vulgata, longicauda ssp eminens, hybrid C longicauda ssp eminens x vulgata; D laxiflora; T antennifera, macrophylla, & hybrid antennifera x macrophylla.

From here we took a long short cut to Cheyne Beach. There is a ford across the Kalgan River along Mindijup Rd that was too deep and rough for 2WD vehicles, so it was back track and down to Bakers Junction. We found the object of the trip *C granitora*, one two headed specimen growing between two rocks, one to sit on the other to put your feet on so that the photos could be taken in comfort.

We overnighted at Cheyne Beach Caravan Park, where some members of the party who had not had enough orchiding for the day searched round the park with success. Next day bright and early, bunk beds not being comfortable, we headed off for Green Range to Kojannerup Rd. It did not help that there are two roads within sight of each other with the same name. We found orchids at both sites, C fuscolutescens, flava, polychroma, heberleana; & D laxiflora. Thelymitra sps were in bud. Off once again to Two Peoples Bay Rd where Bill Burton had seen Calochilus aff robertsonii (swamp beard). We did not find Bill's ones but

found others. We also found D laxiflora at this quick stop.

Next we hightailed to Sheepwash Reserve on the Mt Barker-Denmark Rd. The warm weather was starting to take its toll. We still found C starteorum, pectinata; D longifolia & laxiflora.

We decided to have a lunch stop and our final look at Tenterden Reserve. Though relatively dry we found *C caesarea* ssp *caesarea*, longicauda ssp longicauda & eminens, polychroma, hybrid longicauda ssp eminens x caesarea ssp caesarea; *D laxiflora*; Lyp serratus; *T antennifera* & pauciflora. Altogether a good weekend.

# FIELD TRIP BROOKTON HWY OCTOBER 19 by NOEL CLARKE

Once again the Cheyne Beach mob, minus Margaret Fox replaced by Bill Burton, met at Edison Mill Rd. formerly Dale West Rd. Those with internet access would have seen the trip on our site. The object of our trip was to find the granite bee.

A short distance down Edison Mill Rd and along a track we had success. Though dry we saw lots of orchids. There were lots of bees, small ones and tall ones, large flowers and smaller flowers, all growing together. We photographed some big ones. Were they the granite bee? Your guess is as good as mine. To muddy the situation a few kilometres down the road at a flat winter wet area we saw the same mixture.

At the first site we found C flava, longicauda ssp longicauda, marginata; D laxiflora, aff laxiflora (pg 431); E emarginata; P gracile, ovale; Tantennifera, crinita, macrophylla, aff macrophylla undescribed & villosa. At the second site we found C falcata, uliginosa ssp candicans; P gracile, ovale; D laxiflora & aff laxiflora (call it what you like). Being half way to Skeets Place (no sign at road now) we decided to have a look. We found Pt sargentii; T macrophylla & aff macrophylla undescribed. Don Ward found a Calochilus aff robertsonii (wandoo beard) passed its prime but added it to his gallery. The undescribed T aff macrophylla is like the granite sun but is not clump forming and has a much shorter leaf.

# TALK BY ANDREW BROWN

Andy spoke to us about *Prasophyllum & Microtis*.

Microtis are later flowering spread from September to January. Some of the species inhabit the dry interior though M media is widespread. The difference between the species and subspecies is very hard to

distinguish with the naked eye. An 8 times magnifying glass is a must if you want to see the difference which is mostly in the labellum. *Microtis* has not escaped the penchant for change. *M atrata* has been proposed as *Microtidium atrata* and *M obicularis* to be *Hydrorchis obicularis*.

Genoplesium nigricans has not escaped either. It was initially Prasophyllum nigricans, changed to Genoplesium nigricans and is now proposed as Corunastylis nigricans.

Andy then showed slides illustrating all the Microtis species & most of the Prasophyllum species pointing out the salient features. Regarding the name changes which was published in the January 2000 issue of The Orchadian. Like all proposed name changes they are subject to acceptance by the users; you & me.


### **GUEST SPEAKER:**
