MINUTES TO THE MEETING: 17/09/ 2008

As printed in the Bulletin with corrections: Noel Clarke pg 4 3rd item. PLANT TABLE:

Bill showed us *Corybas* recurvus and *Diuris* subsp. Eneabba.

Mark showed us *Pterostylis* sanguinea and *Pterostylis* aspera from the Gnangara Mound and Pterostylis sargentii

FIELD TRIP REPORTS:

- 1. Sarah and Bill on way back from Eneabba found *T*. apiculata, *P*. dilatata.
- 2. Gary at Lovers' Leap found Hare Orchids (Leporella fimbriata), Leeks, Donkeys and Robust Snails(*P*. dilatata)

- 3. Mark Brundrett was on a fungi trip to Denmark and found Corybas recurvus under Peppermints and *P*. vittata.
- Don at Toodyay found P. sanguine, P. vittata and the Broad Petalled Snail (P.aff.nana). Kangaroos have eaten Diuris that were there. P. concava coming up, T. benthamiana leaf and C. arrecta leaf.
- 5. Escarpment Roleystone *C*. flava leaves and spider leaves and *P*. aspera.
- Ursula went to Nettleton Rd near railway crossing- opposite side to burnt area saw bird orchids and Autumn Leeks(*Prasophyllum* parvifolium). None on burnt area but lots of birds coming.
- 7. Wayne and Louise went on a walk a couple of weeks ago at Lake Nerricup Carnamah with a group trying to raise awareness of proposed limestone quarry in this pristine bush. Found lots of *Prasophyllum* parvifolium. Last week went on walk in Mundaring and found lots of *P*. barbata in bud on Bibbulmun Track near Hills Centre and *P*. sanguinea in flower.
- 8. Margaret Petridis found Kalbarri Shell Orchids (*P.* aff. aspera) near Dongara.



Members Field reports







David, Stuart and John set out on Saturday morning to visit Watheroo as part of Adopt an Orchid. On the road travelling north we stopped at near Gilingarra to see *C.* subsp. *vanleeuwenii* (Moora Spider Orchid) which was in good flower. We also found *C. hiemalis* (Dwarf Common Spider Orchid) at a few locations. The Adopt an Orchid searches for *C. dundasiae* (Patricia's Spider Orchid) found plants in flower at one location (more in the report at the November meeting).

We then travelled on to Masons road and when we had nearly reached the Gunyidi-Wubin road we could see the spider orchids from the car. We were treated to a magnificent display of *Caladenia exilis* subsp. *excilis* (Salt Lake Spider Orchid) together with huge patches of *Pt* sp 'hairy' (Hairy Stemmed Snail Orchid) and seemingly endless numbers of Blue Fairies.

Although they are not due out until September, in another location, we found one Hinged Dragon Orchid (*C. drakeoides*) in flower and many other buds that will be open soon.

The next day saw John and Stuart stop at a little corner north of Watheroo on the road to Coorow. While it was much overgrown since years past, Stuart located some flowers of *C. pendens* subsp. *talbotii* (Talbot's Spider Orchid). They then proceeded to the western end of the Gunyidi-Wubin Road where there lay another treat. Many, many little red *C. footeana* (Crimson Spider Orchid), more Blue Fairies, many *Pt. scabra* (Green-veined Shell Orchid) and some lovely *C. denticulata* (Yellow Spider Orchid), although there was some conjecture as to whether the labellum was 'distinctively white'.

A substantial diversion went via a 'C. cristata site' which had none in evidence and then onto Cockleshell



Gully. Here there was much in bud, but little in flower except one lone *C. marginata* (White Fairy Orchid) and the inevitable Blue Fairies. Up the road to Hill River Nature Reserve saw one lone *C. longicauda* subsp. borealis (Daddy-long-legs Spider Orchid) open, but many more in bud.

The burnt area north of Lancelin was visited on the way home, but yielded little. Even so, it was a good trip.

Dundas Spider's flowering and many more in bud. Came across a couple of Snail Orchids and even managed to find a cream coloured Dundas Spider. From there I went to the salt lakes on Gunyidi-Wubin Rd.


Along the Gunyidi-Wubin Rd I stopped at a couple of places. At the first stop there were hundreds of Salt Lake Spider's flowering and also some Candy Orchids and a couple of different Snail Orchids as well. Amazing to see so many Spiders flowering at once and more on the other side of the road as well. Good year for them up there this year.

At the other spot I stop further up the road there were again lots of Blue Beards flowering and ended up seeing lots of Sugar Orchids as well.

Surprisingly I saw 4 Jack in a Box flowering, could have been

more I didn't see but wasn't really looking for them. Usually don't see them flowering up there for another month so they were a bonus. Saw a few Pink Candies flowering as well. More Salt Lake Spider's as well, more than I have ever seen flowering there. I left there and headed back towards home and stopped at Moora (Candy Reserve).


I just had to stop here, I like the coloured Moora Spider's and there are lots of them this year. Went for a walk out the back of the reserve and came across a patch of Mini Donkey's (12 plants flowering). Made it well worth the stop.
