2. BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE PREVIOUS MEETING

2.1 First Aid Training: Kim Hanson had contacted Steven Lewson of Roleystone who said that the course had to be 6 hours long over either 1 day or over 2 days of 3 hours each, but there had to be a minimum of 10 people and the cost would be \$65 per person. John Ewing said that he would like to see a course happen but would like the club to subsidise it. He suggested that the subsidy should be \$30 per person.

Moved Noel Hoffman, seconded Donna Wajon that the club subsidise each person doing the course of \$30 each. Eddy Wajon brought to the attention of the meeting that Noel Clark would say that members should actually pay individually. The motion was put to the meeting and was carried unanimously.

FIELD TRIP REPORTS



SOUTHERN RIVERS GROUP FIELD TRIP REPORT

Cape Riche and Miller's Point, Saturday 15th September 2012

Saturday 15th September 11 members in 4 cars travelled east from Albany to Cape Riche. Here we saw 19 different orchids in a small area. Though the variety was there, numbers were much less than in better seasons. Ericksonella saccharata (Sugar Orchid), Elythranthera brunonis (Purple Enamel Orchid), Caladenia flava subsp. flava (Cowslip Orchid), Thelymitra flexuosa (Twisted Sun Orchid), Thelymitra antennifera (Lemon-scented Sun Orchid , Vanilla Orchid), Diuris laxiflora (Bee Orchid), Pterostylis sp. 'limestone' (Limestone Snail Orchid), Pterostylis turfosa (Bearded Bird Orchid), Caladenia polychroma (Joseph's Spider Orchid), Caladenia pectinata (King Spider Orchid), Pterostylis vittata (Banded Greenhood), Caladenia barbarossa (Common Dragon Orchid), Caladenia vulgata (Common Spider Orchid), Cyanicula sericea (Silky Blue Orchid), Caladenia longicauda subsp. australora (Southern White Spider Orchid), Cyrtostylis robusta (Mosquito Orchid, Large Gnat Orchid) and Thelymitra crinita (Blue Lady Orchid), Pterostylis recurva (Jug Orchid), Diuris corymbosa (Common Donkey Orchid) and a number of the Pterostylis rufa group in bud.

After leaving Cape Riche we travelled to Miller's Point, stopping at Pallinup en route. Again the numbers were less than in past years and also





fewer varieties were seen. At the Pallinup we also found Caladenia longicauda subsp. eminens (Stark White Spider Orchid), Caladenia falcata (Fringed Mantis Orchid) and Cyanicula Gemmata (Blue China Orchid).

At Miller's Point a similar scenario greeted us, as did a multitude of Mossies, usually a good sign where Orchids are concerned!! (This is not necessarily backed by scientific evidence!) Here we found *Corybas* leaves, *Caladenia reptans* subsp. *reptans* (Little Pink Fairy), *Pterostylis* sp. 'Millers Point' (Dwarf Snail Orchid), *Caladenia latifolia* (Pink Fairies), *Cyrtostylis huegelii* (Midge Orchid), *Cyanicula aperta* (Western Tiny Blue Orchid), *Cryptostylis ovata* (Slipper Orchid), *Prasophyllum* sp. 'early' (Scented Autumn Leek Orchid), *Caladenia doutchiae* (Purple-veined Spider Orchid) and many *Microtis* which were too immature to identify.

The weather was kind to us and a thoroughly enjoyable day had by yours truly.

WONGAN HILLS Week-end

A select group of Members ventured to Wongan Hills for the week-end of September 15/16. On the way into Wongan Hills around Lake Ninan Trish and I found some small spider orchids (Caladenia dimidia/vulgata?), and Purple-veined Spider Orchid (Caladenia doutchiae). The main group (Trish, Ramón, Peter, Debbie, Beth, Delys, and Marian) met up at the visitors centre where were greeted by Rod Clarke and Lyn Phillips who provided a lot of help as always. Lyn joined us for most of the day in order to show us where some orchids had been seen recently. A big thanks to the Rod and Lyn.

At Elphin Reserve (east) we found a range of Caladenia spider orchids (Caladenia longicauda, Caladenia roei, Caladenia flava, sp.), Smooth-billed or Broad-billed Duck Orchids, Purple Enamel Orchid, Vanilla Orchid, Pouched Leek Orchid, and Donkey Orchids. Across the road in the west part of the reserve we found Flying and either Smooth-billed or Broad-billed Duck Orchids, Warty Hammer Orchids and Shirt Orchids. On the Ballidu road, just outside the town, there were plenty Vanilla Orchids (Lemon-scented Sun Orchids), more of those hard to





identify small spiders and ant orchids.
On the Sunday morning Kelvin joined us at the Christmas Rock Trail where we saw the small white spiders, Ant Orchids, Cowslips and donkey orchids.

Most of the group then ventured out to Dingo Rock to see Vanilla Orchids, Donkey Orchids, Cowslip Orchids and Little Laughing Leek Orchids. On a tip off from Peter, who had to return to Perth, we pushed on to the Cullimbin Well

Nature Reserve on the 54 Gate Road, to find a couple of the Lazy Spider Orchids much to our delight. There were also some Cowslips and Ant Orchids, donkey orchids and a single Drooping Spider Orchid.

So it was altogether a very enjoyable and relaxing week-end, with something for everyone. Full list of what we found is below.

HAIL TO HEATWAVE - Busselton Trip

Saturday dawned cloudy but fine after three days rain, hail, sleet and snow. Ha-ha!! Our Experimental Group of Intrepid Orchidists (EGIOs) found themselves at Sugar Loaf Rock at which point they were bombarded with a whole pile of maps and data sheets and then told "you're on your own. Good luck!!" Actually we didn't lose that many. For some it was their first glance at *Caladenia nivalis*.





In dribs and drabs they moved on to the next spot and behold a forest, well a few, of *Caladenia viridescens*, hybrids, *Caladenia chapmanii*, *Caladenia applanata* subsp. *applanata* and *Diuris* sp. 'Dunsborough'. Then off to lunch at Burton's Rd (renamed Bill's Road) which was awash with *Elythranthera brunonis*. Up a couple of tracks to see more *Caladenia viridescens* and a *Caladenia rhomboidiformis* (but not their last).



On to Blythe Reserve and a field of *Caladenia chapmanii* (huge clumps), *Caladenia ferruginea*, *Diuris* sp. 'Dunsborough', *Caladenia pectinata, and Prasophyllum regium, Lyperanthus serratus* and *Diuris longifolia*. It was such a display that people were off in all directions.



Some ventured forth on the next leg, a bit of a lengthy drive down to Moses Rock for a look at some *Caladenia applanata* subsp. *applanata* and *Thelymitra granitora*. Unfortunately, the little sun orchid wouldn't show its little head due to the persistently cloudy sky.

Special surprise for the end of the day, 'yellow' red beaks (*Pyrorchis nigricans*) at Ellensbrook Rd, courtesy of our infamous author Andrew Brown. Also a favourite *Leptoceras menziesii* and beautiful *Prasophyllum giganteum*. Also seen *Caladenia latifolia*, *Caladenia flava* subsp. *flava*, *Caladenia attingens* subsp. *attingens*, *Diuris* aff. *magnifica*, *Cyanicula sericea* and *Microtis media*.





Day Two dawned bright and sunny. Group met in Kilcarnup Rd and collected sheet of instructions for the day. First stop *Caladenia excelsa*. What a beautiful orchid! Also *Prasophyllum elatum* and others. Then onto Caves Rd for more of the same plus *Caladenia longicauda* subsp. *clivicola* and a colourful wildflower display.





Whisked down to McLeod Creek 'P' stop to spy one or two *Caladenia longicauda* subsp. *merrittii*. Also discovered *Pterostylis turfosa* in bud and *Caladenia cairnsiana*, *Caladenia reptans* subsp. *reptans*, *Caladenia magniclavata* and *Caladenia infundibularis*.

Lunch in Witchcliffe 'forest' surrounded by *Caladenia citrina, Caladenia rhomboidiformis* (told you it wasn't their last), *Lyperanthus serratus*, *Caladenia attingens* subsp. *attingens*, *Caladenia flava* subsp. *sylvestris, Caladenia ensata, Caladenia macrostylis* and various hybrids plus others.





At which point due to the exhaustion of the trip leaders we headed back to the Gracetown Caravan Park to be entertained by possum antics and snake tales around the barbie. There was even a *Caladenia excelsa* outside our caravan door much to Peter's disgust as he'd been searching the district for one. There were hammers and ducks down the track too!

Day Three was warm again. Today was 'avoid the snake day!' We met at Ambergate Reserve to find *Prasophyllum triangulare*. Unfortunately, we didn't spot any but did catch a couple of tigers in the reeds (scaly kind not orchid kind). Also discovered *Caladenia pectinata* growing along the roadside.





Guided tour of bush containing none other than *Caladenia procera*. Thanks to Ann Storrie for showing us her little patch of heaven. Saw *Microtis media* and patches of *Caladenia latifolia* and others.

Anyone for fishing? In Fish Rd swamp of course, for *Caladenia paludosa*. Up to our knees in wellies we plodded through muddy fields to find *Diuris carinata*, such a small thing but well worth the effort. Anna spied another of those scaly horrors. Someone spied a *Thelymitra vulgaris* and there were a few *Thelymitra flexuosa* and *Thelymitra antennifera*. After extensive searching no sign of the elusive *Caladenia paludosa*.

We all go our separate ways hopefully with a satisfied grin after a good day's orchid hunting.

The Northcliffe Trip

13th -14th October, 2012

Meeting place will be the Northcliffe Visitor Centre (Muirillup Rd) at 9am on both Saturday 13th and Sunday 14th October.

We are organising the use of a 4WD bus to take up to 13 passengers in to the coast on the Saturday, via deep sandy tracks. The use of the bus will minimise vehicle traffic and difficult driving conditions for passengers. The driver/guide is an experienced driver with local knowledge of good orchid locations. At present we have 11 confirmed passengers, so there are only 2 seats left to fill the bus.

The bus company can also do lunch for \$3 per person, so I have taken the liberty of ordering lunch for a full bus. This will bring the cost up to \$70 pp, with 13 passengers. They also provide tea and coffee, and fruit as part of the fare. I have pre-paid the bus hire fee and will pay for the lunch as well, so people just need to reimburse me.

People without 4WD vehicles will be unable to get into this site.

People with 4WD vehicles who are confident and able to negotiate deep sandy tracks will be able to follow the bus in. We may have to do some car pooling to take in members who do not have 4WD vehicles to the beach.

We will visit areas on the Saturday morning that are likely to be accessible for all vehicles. The trip to the beach in the bus and 4WD will be in the afternoon. Alternative areas will be suggested for those who cannot get into the beach.

We are hoping to see good numbers of *Caladenia gardneri* and *Caladenia interjacens*, with hybrids between the two in the beach area. There should also be some interesting fire stimulated orchids to find, e.g. *Prasophyllum*, *Cyanicula*, *Thelymitra* and more.

We may need to split the group into	two depending on numbers and access to	4WD vehicles.
