

FIELD TRIP TO MT. RIDLEY 26th August 1979 by Don Voight

Mt Ridley is approximately 40 km east of Grasspatch Townsite, the last 15 km are bush track along survey grid lines. (The area is due for release in the future for farming.)

After good mid-winter rains, we had thoughts of the track being too wet, but for a few patches of water on the track it was fairly good going although one patch of mud blocked us. We spent 10 minutes clearing a detour, but on looking across the other edge discovered one already made. After checking it for soundness, used it to pass the mudhole.

On the last leg near Mt Ridley we found the track inundated for about 40 metres. After checking the bottom and driving through it, we drained it by cutting a ditch on the lower side - the grader had built banks as it levelled the track.

Just before the Outcrop we passed the Old Well used by pioneers as they drove stock to Stations East of Norseman.

The party consisted of W.A. Group members Mr & Mrs Keally Holt and family Frank Magaganotti from Salmon Gums and myself driving up from Esperance. After combing the southern slopes, Caladenia deformis, C. hirta, C. filamentosa, Acianthus reniformis (flowers all chewed on Acianthus) all these were abundant. We then diverted upwards climbing alon a gentle gradient checking all depressions and cracks. Diuris longifolia in seed or chewed off. Prasophyllum m acrostachyum var. ringens, Caladenia flava with faint red stripe only but flowers 60mm. This was the only depression with Caladenia flava growing in it that we saw. The plants of Pterostylis vittata had large capsules all nearing shedding stage, these plants up to 20cm tall. Along a small crack at the summit were eight plants of Pterostylis rufa ssp? thriving on the extreme north edge of a sheer drop. The flower spikes 8 cm tall already. A very good position for seed dispersal as winds would give access to all the surrounding area.

Smyth Road Reserve

Orchids are coming up all over the place and many more new plantings have been made by the wardens. Several species are already in flower and others will be by the first week in September. These include Caladenia gemmata, dilatata, flava, huegelii, longiclavata, latifolia, menziesii, filamentosa and hirta. The blue enamel with the pink to flower later. Greenhoods - barbata and recurva. Sun orchids - crinita, nuda, antennifera, with fuscolutea later on. Leek orchids - fimbria and elatum. Where else could you see so many orchids in just half an acre. There are at least thirty species.

New members may like to know where to come. Our block is in Smyth Road, Nedlands, just opposite the croquet club. Enter by the small gate and look around. Small white markers will give the abbreviated botanical names and numbers of plants for each year. Note the magnificent stands of kangaroo paws, catspaws etc. Pull up some veldt grass if you have time. If you would prefer an escorted tour one Sunday morning ring Dave Emery on ______.
