## FIELD TRIPS (prepared by Ian Greeve)

Next Field Trip: -

Saturday 18th August. Day trip to Bindoon area, for early flowering orchids. Meet at the Bindoon Tavern at 10.00am.

<u>Sunday 19th August Field Trip Cancelled.</u> An extensive search of the areas proposed to be visited has failed to produce any sign of Thelymitra variegata or T. spiralis. Consequently the proposed field trip has been cancelled.

Sunday 19th to Sunday 26th August. KALBARRI TRIP. Trip leader is Bill Jackson

Sunday 19th, meet at Regans Ford 10.00am sharp. Visit orchid sites enroute to Cockleshell Gully. Overnight bush camp at Cockleshell Gully.

Monday 20th, search Cockleshell Gully area, leave in time to reach McQueens Caravan Park (just north of the Arrowsmith River) by late afternoon. Overnight at McQueens.

Tuesday 21st, leave A.M. for Northampton, visiting orchid sites enroute. Overnight at Northampton Caravan Park.

Wednesday 22nd, leave A.M. for Kalbarri, visiting orchid sites enroute. Arrive midday, book into Caravan Park (probably Tudor), visit local orchid site.

Thursday 23rd, orchid sites "Z" Bend etc.


Friday 24th, leave for Horrocks Beach Caravan Park in time to arrive by early afternoon, visit local orchid sites.

Saturday 25th, visit Point Gregory Reserve orchid site, and Nanson Road site enroute to Caravan Park at Dongarra for overnight stop. Sunday 26th, head for home.

This trip is highly recommended to members. The leader did this trip in August 1988, and approximately 40 species of orchids should be sighted, including Caladenia crebra, C. wanosa and hybrids, plus the Kalbarri Drakea and Paracaleana, and the colourful C. flava hybrids from this area.

Intending participants must register with the Group Field Trip Organiser (Ian Greeve).

## Mt. Jackson Trip - 1st; 2nd; 3rd September.



Take right fork through Lk Deborah, don't go to Mt. Jackson station. Visitors are not welcome.

September 1st; 2nd; 3rd. MT. JACKSON. Noel Clarke and Bill Jackson are meeting at Bullfinch on Thursday 30th August P.M. and will proceed to the Mt. Jackson area on Friday 31st August A.M., to set up camp and reconnoiter the area. Members who wish to make an early start are welcome to join them.

Members who cannot start early (workers not the idle rich) meet at Bullfinch on Saturday 1st September at 10.00am opposite the Hotel.

The gravel road to Mt. Jackson is approximately 120kms from Bullfinch and last available fuel and supplies are at Southern Cross. We will be camping and intending trippers will have to provide their own facilities and supplies. The area is covered with mining leases so to prevent being ordered off - no metal detectors please.

September 8th and 9th. Wongan Hills eastward (members only)
To search for Caladenia cristata and see other wheatbelt orchids.
Meet at Wongan Hills Railway Station at 10.00am. We are going to stay at Wongan Hills overnight either at the Hotel (where we have booked 5 twins at \$38.00 per night and 4 singles at \$25.00 per night. Breakfast can be included at \$8.00 for cooked or \$5.00 for continental) or at the caravan park. We need to know numbers and required accommodation ASAP. Please ring F.T. Coordinator or let us know at the August meeting or by 30th August at the latest.

Saturday September 15th Day trip to Sullivan Rock. Meet 10.00am at Sullivan Rock (65 km peg near Gleneagle Forrest sign) right hand side of Albany Highway.

September 22nd/23rd Moodiarrup - "Capercup" We will be guests of Wendy and Michael Cusack on their property "Capercup". There is a shearing shed available to stay in, or bring your own tents, campers etc.

FIELD TRIP REPORT: 25/7/90 TO 29/7/90 - WAVE ROCK/ONGERUP We have just returned from a 6 day field trip to Wave Rock. We were keen to go over territory usually looked at in spring, with particular attention to the rock outcrops between Lake King and Wave Rock. Sites visited were as follows:-

25/7/90 Purnta Rock (Approximately 34 km north of Lake King), Rock & Mallee area (Approximately 4 km north of Purnta Rock) and Holt Rock surrounds.

26/7/90 Bushfire Rock Natural Reserve (East of Wave Rock), Mallee areas on Hyden - Norseman Road, and Wave Rock area.

27/7/90 The Humps (N/East of Wave Rock) and King Rocks (N/East of Wave Rock)

28/7/90 Lake Hurlstone Nature Reserve and Rock, Holt Rock again and areas 4 km North of Purnta Rock again.

29/7/90 Area South of Ongerup.

## LIST OF ORCHIDS FOUND

Caladenia sigmoidea - at Purnta Rock and area 4 km North. Mostly in bud, but plenty in flower as well. Caladenia filamentosa sp. - in bud and leaves only. At most of the sites visited. Caladenia filamentosa sp. - five plants flowering at Wave Rock only. Caladenia flava - leaves only. Caladenia deformis - flowering at Wave Rock and The Humps.

Pterostylis mutica - flowering and in bud at a number of sites. Pterostylis nana sp. - prolific in flower at almost every site - flower shape did not concur with description in David Jones' book - Galea definitely down curved at apex.

Pterostylis vittata - small brown flowers, flowering and in seed at a number of sites. Pterostylis recurva - at most sites in bud and a few flowers open at "Bushfires Rock". Pterostylis sargentii - only sighted at Holt Rock (two flowering, one in bud).

Genoplesium nigricans - at most sites, all in seed and some plants still very green.

Thelymitra antennifera - in bud at Wave Rock only. Thelymitra sp. - leaves at all sites.

Diuris sp. (corymbosa?) - only at "Bushfires Rock" - in flower. Thelymitra variegata and Thelymitra spiralis - south of Ongerup.

We could not resist extending the trip by one day in order to look for Thelymitra variegata - found eight plants in flower - two double headers and one Thelymitra spiralis sp. also in flower.

Spent three nights at Wave Rock Caravan Park - very nice park but was very cold, minus 1 and minus 2 deg at night. Would be a good location for a WANOSCG field trip in late August.

#### BILL JACKSON

(Chris and I found approximately 18 different orchid species at Wave Rock in the first week of September, 1989. We agree this area would make a worthwhile field trip. Editor).

PORONGERUPS/KENDENUP 24th June - 2nd July. Cy. robusta, Cy. reniformis, Pt. Vittata, E. dilitatus (flowers), L. nigricans, T. serratus, Ca. menziezii, D. laxiflora, Pt. recurva, Pt. nana, Cr. ovata, T. crinita, T. nuda, T. fuscolutea, various Ca. species (leaves).

DENMARK 28th June. Pt. vittata, Cy. robusta (flowers) Pt. recurva, T. crinata, T. nuda, E. dilatatus.

MANDALAY BEACH ROAD 27th June. Cy. robusta, Cy. hueglii, Pt. vittata, Pt. robusta, Co. dilatatus (flowers), Pt. recurva, various Ca. species (leaves).

STIRLING RANGE 2nd July. Pt. dilatata, Pt. nana, Pt. concava (flowers), T. crinita, Ly. serratus, Le. fimbriata, Ly. nigricans, Pt. recurva, Ca. menziesii, various Ca. species (leaves).

BREMER BAY 5th July. Pt. Vittata, Pt. nana, Cy. dilatatus (flowers), Ca. eminens (bud), Pt. recurva, Ca. menziesii, Ly. nigricans, Le. fimbriata, E. dilatatus, various Ca. species, various Pr. species (leaves). Bill Burton and Sarah Atkinson

D. purdiei is not the only rare endangered orchid, also at risk are Drakea elastica (jeanensis) 'Glossy-leaved Hammer Orchid', Drakea sp. (southwest) 'Small Hammer Orchid', Caladenia sp. (coastal plain), Ca. hueglii, Grand Spider Orchid.

It was moved Merritt/Burton "that the Group contact the Minister and media to find out what steps have been taken to protect Ca. hueglii, and ask if the developer has been given authorisation to take these plants". Carried.
