Dr Steven Hopper is CEO of Kings Park and Botanic Gardens, Patron of WANOSCG And long time collector and researcher in orchids.

Andrew Brown is Threatened Flora Officer for CALM, co author of "Orchids of South West Australia" and life member of WANOSCG.

Steve and Andrew have been responsible for a number of Orchid Publications in recent times, most notably the Review of Caladenia in Nuytsia Vol. 12 in 2002.

These two well-respected botanists gave their view on the recent taxonomic changes in the orchid world and explained their wider views on taxonomy.

This was accompanied by a great collection of slides and gave some insight into the next level of taxonomy and nomenclature applied to our orchids.

TALK BY STEPHEN HOPPER & ANDREW BROWN ON ORCHID TAXONOMY.

Steve Hopper spoke first. He illustrated his talk with slides & overheads.

As we all know in recent times there has been an upheaval in generic names. Orchids are the largest family of flowering plants and are relatively old, about 80 millions years. Most of our Australian orchids fall into the tribe *Diurideae*. *Pterostylis* are of a different tribe. He then showed slides from other countries of orchid genera that look like *Diurideae* but are not related.

Till relatively recent times nomenclature decisions were focused on floral characteristics. The advent of DNA sequencing opened up a Pandora's box, producing surprising results. One example is C saccharata that is genetically not related to Caladenia. Similarly Cyanicula are closely related to Caladenia, except for C deformis (Pheladenia deformis) that is not related. He illustrated the relationships with a tree somewhat similar to the tree on page 7 of Nuytsia V14 No 1&2, 2001. The tree showed the percentage relationships showing distinct division lines. These groupings could provide the key to the division of Caladenia into other genera or sub-genera. Some new genera have already been created and accepted by most contemporary botanists, e.g. Cyanicula, Pheladenia. However, recent proposals to raise subgenera of Caladenia to full generic status (e.g. Arachnorchis, Jonesiopsis, Stegostyla, Drakonorchis, Petalochilus, Calonema, Calonemorchis) are disputed by an increasing number of botanists on the grounds that these are an unnecessary change against the intent of the preamble in the International Code of Botanical Nomenclature.

The same arguments can be applied to *Pterostylis*.

Meetings were held in March & October 2003 and another paper is in the pipeline. Hopefully 2004 will see some resolution.

Andy Brown distributed a paper entitled "Generic Revision of Australian Orchidaceae" that I have reproduced on pages 9 - 11.

Listed below are the current generic changes in Caladenia, Caleana, Calochilus, Corybas, Genoplesium, Microtis and Pterostylis as proposed by Szlachetko, Jones and Clements. Names in **bold** are currently accepted in WA.

Notes

Szlachetko (Genera et species orchidalium 1 (2001)), split Caladenia into four genera, Caladenia, Calonema, Jonesiopsis, Pentisia and Phlebochilus and further split Caladenia into two sections, Caladenia and Caladeniastrum.

Hopper and Brown (Lindleyana 15(2); (2000)) had already placed species in Szlachetko's genus Pentisia into Cyanicula and, in 2001, elevated section Caladeniastrum to subg. Elevatae.

Szlachetko's Calonema contained a range of species from several complexes including the filamentosa, longiclavata, falcata and longicauda complexes. His genus Phlebochilus contained species from the roei, doutchiae complex and Jonesiopsis contained the single species multiclavia.

Jones and Clements (*The Orchadian* Vol. 13, No 9 (2001)) suggested that Szlachetko's elevation of *Calonema* and *Phlebochilus* was illegal as he had not cited a type for either genus. However, this was not correct as a type does not need to be cited when making a new combination (the names had already been used for sections in *Caladenia*).

Szlachetko later (2001) discovered that the generic name Calonema had already been used for another plant genus and created the new genus Calonemorchis to correct his error. In the meantime Jones and Clements had used the name Calonema for members of the filamentosa, doutchiae complex and included multiclavia. They also placed some species that Szlachetko had included in Phlebochilus into Arachnorchis (a new generic name) and Calonema.

Jones and Clements did not recognise Szlachetko's new genus *Jonesiopsis*, stating that it was illegitimate as *Jonesyella* had been published simultaneously. However, the name *Jonesiopsis* is in fact legitimately published as the name *Jonesyella* is regarded as a orthographic error. Following advice from us and staff at Kew, Jones and Clements rectified their mistake (*The Orchadian* Vol. 14, No 4 (2003)) by reinstating *Jonesiopsis* (multiclavia).

Phlebochilus (cairnsiana, doutchiae complex) and Calonema (filamentosa complex) were included as subgenera.
