# Rain finally arrives!

After one of the driest summers on record, good rain falls have been recorded recently from Kalbarri across to Paynes Find. This is good news for several planned field trips to the northern and north east regions to Kalbarri, North East Wheatbelt extended trip and Mukinbudin area after last year's poor rains

The first field trips for the year along the south coast have found various Eriochilus sub species and other early flowering orchids with numbers down reflecting poor early rainfall this year.

### 2. BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE PREVIOUS **MEETING**

- 2.1 The election of a Conservation Officer for 2014: Eddy Wajon nominated Tim Hodgkins to fill the position of WANOSCG Conservation Officer. Kim Hanson seconded this proposal. There were no other nominations. [Tim Hodgkins had offered to accept nomination for the position of Conservation Officer shortly after the March meetings.] The members accepted the proposal unanimously.

The members gave Marina a resounding applause for delivering such a fantastic publication. Marina was presented with some flowers as a small token of WANOSCG's appreciation.

- 4.2 Donna Wajon (26/3/14) Re: Updating of Orchid Sighting Report sheets- in light of the recent revision of orchid names Donna has updated her sighting sheets. The Sighting sheets that were emailed out with the April Bulletin have been further updated (14/4/14).
- 4.3 Andrew Brown Re: Orchid name change Prasophyllum aff. parvifolium (scented autumn leek orchid). It is now officially *Prasophyllum* sp. Early
- 4.4 Christine Lock 25/3/14 Re: reviewing the first aid boxes- The committee support Christine Lock's suggestion that a list of items and their expiry dates be included in the First Aid Boxes.
- 4.5 Eddy Wajon 21/3/14 Re: WANOSCG 40th year conservation initiative - nominating places that are rich in orchids and worthy of elevation to Nature Reserve status
- 4.6 Andrew Brown 21/3/14 Re: Encourage members to donate digital orchid photos and possibility of having all the WA taxa illustrated on the WANOSCG Website
- 4.7 William Gye 29/3/14 6 & 7/4/14 Re: Scanning club slides and storing digitized slides, library and copyright issues

- 5.1 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> May to Walpole area: Members wishing to confirm details for this trip were asked to contact Margaret Petridis after the meeting.
- 5.2 June trip to the Badgingarra area to locate new orchid flowering locations: Rather than having one large group searching for new orchid locations on a single date it was suggested that a number of small groups survey likely habitat over a number of

- dates in June. Please forward any useful information to Kim Hanson
- who has offered to coordinate our efforts in this matter. Members interested in participating in these surveys are asked to contact Kim Hanson.
- 5.3 Eurardy Station: The survey is likely to take place during the last week of August. Only a limited number of members will be able to participate (about 10). Accommodation will be made available to participating members. Margaret is going to suggest that WANOSCG could help Bush Heritage Australia survey for other significant orchid species known to flower at other times.

### **Personal Field Trips:**

A request was made to members to complete personal field trip report forms and give them to the secretary so as to help him record where and what orchids you have seen. Further to this members were reminded to complete Donna's Orchid sighting report forms and forward them to the Registrar.

# 6. WHAT WILL BE FLOWERING IN THE COMING MONTH:

Margaret Petridis gave an excellent short photographic presentation of the orchids that might be found flowering in April and May. This provided a great introduction to the coming May field trip.

### **CONSERVATION REPORT:**

The President presented Tim Hodgkin's report outlining proposed roadside clearings and the possibility of identifying bushland containing significant or rich orchid populations to be nominated for elevation to the status of a nature reserve.

- 7.1 It was the consensus of the meeting that we should contact DPaW with respect to any potential damage that might occur to orchid populations along the Mullewa Wubin Rd.
- 7.2 There was general consensus, "That it would be a good idea to proceed with trying to identify bushland with significant or rich orchid populations with the view of nominating them as a nature reserve at some point in the future".
- 7.3 The meeting was informed about Gail Reid's concerns that fracking may damage water tables in the Dongara region and hence impacting on ecosystems endangering fragile flora including orchids. It was acknowledged that this was likely too big a task for WANOSCG to undertake on its own and that a better strategy might be to raise the matter with the CCWA who might have more resources and expertise in mounting a campaign.

### **GENERAL BUSINESS**

8.1 WANOSCG Photo Competition for 2014: The committee put forward two suggestions:

Donna Wajon - photos of club members in action as a record of the 40<sup>th</sup> year.

ii) Margaret Petridis - photos of orchids formally described in the first 10 years of the group.

- Members agreed that these were both good ideas and WANOSCG should have two separate categories for 2014. Details of the competitions are to be finalized at a later date.
- 8.2 ADORP: Kim Hanson alerted ADORP groups that in 2014 they needed to give special attention to the timely completion and submission of DPaW forms outlining time spent surveying for their adopted orchid(s). An electronic version of the form will be emailed to ADORP group members. Kim Hanson also asked for help from members in searching new likely habitat for his ADORP orchid, C. caesarea subsp. transiens. Please contact Kim for further details.
- 8.3 Raffle and supper rosters members were urged to volunteer for these rosters.
- 8.4 Membership fees are due as of 1<sup>st</sup> February 2014: Members were reminded that, "If membership fees were not received by the end of May then you will not receive a bulletin in June".
- 8.5 Potential Rhizanthella gardneri habitat near Ravensthorpe: Eddy Wajon brought to the member's attention that Main Roads Western Australia (MRWA) has investigated a number of options for the Ravensthorpe Heavy Haulage Bypass Route. In one section near the eastern end of the route, just before the bypass re-connects with South Coast Highway, there is about 2 ha of what has been identified as a Melaleuca hamata thicket will be cleared. From Eddy's understanding, Rhizanthella gardneri has previously been identified as being always found in association with the root system of broom honey myrtle (Melaleuca uncinata). However, with the recent re-examination and re-classification of species in the Melaleuca uncinata complex, he understands that many old records of Melaleuca uncinata are in fact of Melaleuca hamata. Thus, Rhizanthella gardneri may exist in the Melaleuca hamate thickets proposed to be cleared for the Ravensthorpe Heavy Haulage route. Eddy will contact Andrew Brown about this matter.

**GROWER'S TABLE:** No orchids were tabled this month

Chris French gave an enlightening presentation covering the current state of the *Pterostylis nana* complex. It was very well received by members and Chris was kept busy answering questions well after the meeting closed.

# GPS coordinate systems and WANOSCG recording sheets

Please state which GPS coordinate system you used when you report your GPS data to the club registrar. The DPaW "Threatened and Priority Flora Report Form" gives four choices for GPS systems when reporting GPS locations: GDA94/ MGA94, AGD84/AMG84, WGS84 and other. Since the GDA94 coordinate system supersedes the *AGD84* and older coordinate systems our club has agreed, where ever possible, to report our GPS findings using the **GDA94** coordinate system.

So what are these coordinate systems and why does it matter?

The **GDA94** (Geocentric Datum of Australia 1994) system is an Earth-centred system of coordinates that is corrected for local Australian tectonic plate movements. The standard map projection associated with GDA94 is the Map Grid of Australia 1994 (MGA94) and hence the following GDA94/MGA94 reference is often seen as a choice of GPS coordinate system on forms such as the DPaW "Threatened and Priority Flora Report Form".

It should be noted that most GPS receivers compute and store coordinates in terms of the **WGS84** system (the World Geodetic System 1984) and then transform them to other forms when they display this information. The WGS84 is a system of coordinates which like GDA94 is based on the earth's centre of mass. WGS84 reference frames are very closely aligned with the International Terrestrial Reference Frame (ITRF) used by GDA94 and thus for most practical purposes GDA94 and WGS84 coordinates can be considered the same. The disparity between the two coordinate systems is currently about 1m and is primarily due to the tectonic motion of approximately 70 mm per year in a NNE direction since the original models diverged.

Another commonly used coordinate system is the

AGD84 coordinate system (Australian Geodetic Datum of 1984). It uses the Australian National Spheroid (ANS) model which is offset from the Earth's centre of mass by about 200 metres. Since the GDA94 system is Earth-centred this means that AGD84 and GDA94 positions differ by about 200 metres.

Ravensthorpe Heavy Haulage Route Survey

Main Roads WA is proposing to construct the Ravensthorpe Heavy Haulage Route. The preferred route goes north of the town of Ravensthorpe through Salmon Gum woodland. Part of the route passes through *Melaleuca hamata* thicket on shallow soils overlying granite.

The threatened Western Underground Orchid, Rhizanthella gardneri, is found in association with the root system of broom honey myrtle Melaleuca uncinata and Melaleuca hamata which is a member of the Melaleuca uncinata group. Thus, Rhizanthella gardneri may exist in the Melaleuca hamata thickets along the Ravensthorpe Heavy Haulage Route. Rhizanthella gardneri has not previously been reported from the Ravensthorpe region, but this may be because it is very cryptic and there have been no systematic searches for it in the region. However, it is known from Corrigin/Babakin and Munglinup. Ravensthorpe is between these two locations, so it is possible that this orchid is present in the Ravensthorpe region and possibly along the route of the proposed road.

With the support of Andrew Brown and Mark Brundrett, Eddy Wajon is offering to led a trip to Ravensthorpe to undertake a survey of the *Melaleuca hamata* thicket in and near the proposed route of the road to determine whether any *Rhizanthella gardneri* are present in the area.

Expressions of interest are sought from WANOSCG members to participate in this survey. The date of the trip is Saturday and Sunday 5 and 6 July 2014. Members interested in participating are asked to contact Eddy Wajon on or

Note that there is no guarantee that any *Rhizanthella gardneri* will be found. However, there has been some good rains in the Ravensthorpe area recently, so that the conditions are possibly right. It is also hard work examining the area around each *Melaleuca hamata* shrub. However, there may be other orchids present in the area, and this is an opportunity to search for (and possibly find) *Rhizanthella gardneri* in an area where it is currently not known to exist, and thus extend the range of this orchid.

Dozens of *Praecoxanthus aphyllus* (Leafless orchid) were found, from the very colourful to the pale delicate shades. All flowers were in good condition with very few eaten by insects.

A shout from an eagle eyed member brought us all round to see the first *Leporella fimbriata* (Hare orchid). This find made us all look harder with only a few more flowers and buds being located. The 2014 orchid season had begun.

# Perth Group Field Trip Plan for 2014




The Perth group visited the south coast over the weekend 3/4th May, a trip report will be in the June Bulletin
