

There are several reports mainly from the deep South. Ron Heberle brought some flowers up for the George Lullfritz Expo. The heat and the travelling up from Albany wilted quite a lot of the flowers, but he left some with me and I was successful in reviving most of them so that I could photograph them. They were: Caladenia patersonii hybrids, but all the same sort, Diuris emarginata var. pauciflora, Epiblema grandiflorum and one which Ron calls the Albany late yellow. He also left with me a Greenhood which appeared to be a type of Pterostylis sargentii, to take to the meeting and give to Alex George but by the Wednesday it was finished.

We made a trip down to Denmark and while down there had a walk around the bush south west of Peaceful Bay - Walpole Nornalup National Park to be correct. Here I found flowers of Elythranthera emarginata which were really big and beautiful. The only other orchids were leaves and spent seed pods of Caladenia latifolia. Surprisingly there were no snakes, although there were quite a few on the road back to Denmark.

Culture in the Dormant Period - Lal Sheppard

These are the proceedures which I myself adopt and which have proved fairly successful.

At this time of the year most terrestrials have died back although some will be still green of leaf and some of the late flowerers still in flower.

When all these have died back, all pots should be set aside and kept cool by extra shading and occasionally a light spray of water, which will help to save the tubers from drying out too much.

This also has an effect of starting the tubers into early growth.
