FIELD TRIP REPORT - MOUNT DALE 29th OCTOBER

Persistent rain prevented all but the most enthusiastic of orchid lovers from braving the trip. Never the less, 7 vehicles and 15 people turned up at Lesley Park.

Our first stop was at the lower barbeque area of Mt. Dale where we were pleased to find several orchids still in flower, and as an added bonus the rain stopped. Here we found five plants of Lyperanthus serratus and hundreds of Caladenia flava still in flower. Of course the thelemitras were closed, but there were still a few Diuris longifolia in flower. As far as other plants were concerned, there were dryandras and hakeas in flower, stylidiums everywhere and some magnificent verticordias.

We then drove to the lookout where we had our barbeques and sandwiches, and while there walked down the granite outcrops, which were very slippery due to recent rain. However, it was worth it as the views were lovely. Leaving Mt. Dale we made several stops on the way out and although one of the swampy areas looked interesting, nothing of interest was found. We finished the day at Boulder Rock where there had recently been a large spring burn, resulting in no orchids being found there either. It was at this stage that we decided to break up, with several members leaving with instructions on how to find <u>Diuris setacea</u> near Canning Mills Road, which they did!

Despite the inclement weather, we had a good day. Orchids found were: <u>Elythanthera brunonis</u>, <u>E. emarginata</u>, <u>Caladenia longicauda</u>, <u>Diuris longifolia</u>, <u>D. setacea</u>, <u>Thelymitra nuda</u>, <u>T. pauciflora</u>,

T.crinita, Lyperanthus serratus, and Microtis unifolia in flower, Pterostvlis recurva, Thelymitra antennifera, and Prasophyllum parvifolium in seed, and Thelymitra stellata in bud. Joan Greeve
