FIELD TRIP REPORT SUN JUNE 7 TO WATHEROO by Stuart Harris.

Sixteen vehicles met at the Mogumber Tavern on a fine but cool day.

First stop was at a large bush area at Gillingarra, but it was too early for the usual orchids found at this spot. *Eriochilus dilatatus ssp undulatus* was there.

A patch of mallee on top of a rise on Watheroo West Rd was the next stop. Here Caladenia drummondii was found also Eriochilus dilatatus ssp undulatus and Pterostylis vittata. On the Brand Hwy just south of Cataby another stop was made to search for Thelymitra apiculata. One Leporella fimbriata was found but no apiculata.

Last stop for the day was on the West Mogumber Rd (now a lovely sealed highway!!) at the regular site. This was the lunch stop, and everyone grabbed food & walked. Gloria Jackson was the first to find *Thelymitra apiculata*, & many more followed. We were fortunate with the weather; another hour and the cloud would have been in. Quite a lot of colour variation between the orchids led to much changing of position for the keen photographers. By the time all photos were done, it was time to head home, after a long but fairly successful day.

DONNA WAJON'S PEANUT BUTTER BLOSSSOMS

Some members on the Corrigin trip asked for a copy of Donna Wajon's cookie recipe. Here it is. Good cooking ladies.

½ cup butter or margarine 1 egg
½ cup peanut butter 1 tsp vanilla
½ cup sugar 2 tbs milk
½ cup brown sugar 1 tsp baking soda
1 ¾ cup plain flour ¼ tsp salt
5.3 oz (150g) bag Hershey's Kisses Milk
Chocolate (approx 30 kisses)

- 1. Preheat oven 375° F (190° C).
- Cream together butter, peanut butter, sugar, egg, vanilla and milk.
- Sift together the dry ingredients: flour, soda and salt.
- Blend dry ingredients into creamed ingredients and mix thoroughly.
- Shape dough into balls (approx 30).
- Roll balls in sugar and place on cookie sheet.
- 7. Bake 8 minutes.
- Remove from oven, top each with a solid milk chocolate kiss. Press down firmly so cookie cracks round the edge.
- Return to oven. Bake 2 to 5 minutes longer until golden brown.
