BUSSELTON FIELD TRIP REPORT 17/18 AUGUST by MARY HARRIS

Seventeen members met at Bunbury at the start of a fine sunny weekend.

Our first stop was at Capel, on Gavins Rd that was a good place to start, as our visitor Peter, Christine's brother found Tvariegata after only a few minutes search. Despite it being early morning the single flower was open enough to photograph. Only one plant was found. Here we also found 2 Diuris sp. Western sandplain ms?, several Pt vittata & recurva and a lot of Pt aff nana (limestone snail). Across the road were C reptans and a single Pyrochis nigricans in flower. Site 2 was the Ruabon Reserve on the Ludlow Hethergreen Road. Here we saw the Diuris we had seen at Capel and the first of many Cyrtostylis huegelii, very robust plants with many flowers. We also saw Prasophyllum parvifolium, Pt vittata, pyramidalis & aff nana (limestone snail). There were many Leporella leaves with one plant still in reasonable flower. There were leaves of T benthamiana & Cryptostylis ovata and several Caladenia & Paracaleana in bud.

Site 3 was in the Tuart Forest on Ludlow North Rd. Not a lot here (apart from Arum Lilies) but we did see more *Cryptostylis huegelii & Pt* aff nana (short eared snail).

Site 4, the last for the day was the picnic area on Tuart Drive in the Ludlow forest. Once again Cyrtostylis huegelii was the main species seen, some very big plants ranging in colour from very pale to almost dark chocolate. One Caladenia flava was seen, and many leaves of C latifolia &L menziesii. Pt aff nana (short eared snail) was present in little colonies. Sunday was clear and fine, a bit cool to start the day at 9 a.m. at Locke Reserve on Caves Rd. The object of the search here was Corybas and we were leased with our search. We found Corybas despectans & recurvus in good numbers, some pollinated and a lot still in bud. Even the photographers were happy. Cyrtostylis huegelii was again the order of the day, in huge numbers. Pt aff nana (short eared snail) was here too.

From Locke Reserve we drove out to Meelup Beach where we found *C caesarea* ssp *maritima* among the rocks. *Cyrtostylis*

huegelii, Prasophyllum parvifolium & Pt aff nana (short eared snail) were also found. After a pleasant lunch stop on the grass overlooking beautiful Meelup Beach we dispersed, some going back to Perth, others having a little extra time in Busselton. A good weekend despite the dry season. Thanks Noel, thanks Christine.

FIELD TRIP REPORT 18/19 AUGUST 2002 - Tom Blinco

Following the successful Busselton field trip I had some other business in Pemberton, and following are some details of orchids seen on the next two days.

Jalbarragup Road, near Lilly Road - Pterostylis aff nana (Slender Snail)

Pemberton, near Beedelup Falls - Corybas recurvus (Helmet Orchid), Pt. aff nana (Slender Snail)

Northcliffe, Orchid Road. Not much along here at present except one location where there was Corybas recurvus, although there were plenty of "flying ducks" overhead and lots of kookaburras making a lot of noise each time I started walking - perhaps they were giving me the message!

Bridgetown, Mersea Road - lots of Cyrtostylis huegelii (Midge Orchid, both green and brown forms), a few Pt. vittata (Banded Greenhood), and some C. flava ssp flava (Cowslip Orchid) in bud.

Bridgetown, South Western Highway, north of Mersea Road - C. reptans ssp reptans (Little Pink Fairies), C. flava ssp flava and Pt. vittata, with some T crinita (Blue Lady Orchid) leaves.

Balingup, South Western Highway - Pt. vittata, Pt. aff nana and C. flava ssp flava, two double-headed Caladenia xantha (Primrose Spider Orchid), which I looked at more than twice because of their large size, and a single Caladenia magniclavata (Big Clubbed Spider Orchid) which had one flower and two buds. PS - After leaving Busselton I chose to go to Nannup via Jalbarragup Road. For anyone whom has not used this road I would say "beware" - the early part of the gravel section of this road was quite scary, having probably the loosest surface of any gravel road on which I have driven for a long time, and even at 60 k/h very careful driving was required. Also, some intersections along this road are somewhat different to the way that they appear on the road map. I managed to not head in the wrong direction or get lost, but if there is a next time I think that I will use Vasse Highway!

FIELD TRIP REPORT 22 AUGUST 2002 -Tom Blinco

On this day I went to Wambyn Nature Reserve with Helen and Dary Furniss. As is usual for this location at this time of the year there were lots of *Caladenia longicauda* ssp *eminens* (Stark White Spider Orchid) in flower, with lots of these already finished and many still in bud.

There appeared to be both Diuris brumalis (Winter Donkey Orchid) and D corymbosa (Common Donkey Orchid), all being fairly short in stature. Also seen were Cyanicula deformis (Blue Fairy Orchid), Pterostylis recurva (Jug Orchid), Caladenia flava ssp flava (Cowslip Orchid), Caladenia falcata (Green Spider Orchid) and C x cala, the hybrid between C longicauda ssp eminens and C falcata.

FIELD TRIP REPORT TO BUNBURY 31 AUGUST – 1 SEPTEMBER by MATZ DAHLKAMP

The weather report for the weekend was more than discouraging but including the leader for the day, 5 orchid fanatics turned up. Before we set off, Chris showed us sketches of Pt aff nanas that we might see. At our first stop in Coronation Rd we found lots of Pt aff nanas; a few common names Short-eared Snail, Limestone Snail, and some others that did not fit the descriptions given in the H & B. We also saw Pt aff vittata pg 363, recurva, barbata, pyramidalis; C latifolia, reptans ssp reptans; D aff corymbosa pg 391, aff magnifica pg 395 and Drakea glyptodon in bud

The next stop was on Johnson Rd. Again we saw many types of Pt aff nana, recurva & vittata, Cyrtostylis huegelii, C discoidea & noblis (one open & the rest in bud), speciosa & flava ssp flava in bud & D aff magnifica pg 353.

On we went to "The Old Mill" site. Here we got not only orchids but also rain, luckily only in a short shower. Found, seen & photographed C flava ssp flava, D aff magnifica and according to Chris D nicholsoniarum, Cyrtostylis huegelii, Pt aspera in seed, recurva, pyramidalis and four species of aff nana.

We proceeded to Bagieau Rd where we found — what else but Pt aff nana. We also found in bud E brunonis, C flava & noblis and in flower C noblis, D aff magnifica, Pt pyramidalis, recurva & barbata. C reptans ssp reptans on a tree trunk were past their best. Chris left us here to return to Perth & the remaining 4 carried on to Bunbury.

Sunday - Sherry Thomas led us through their property in Lowden. We went up and down and right and left and it was great. In flower we saw Pt pyramidalis, barbata, vittata, recurva and maybe aff sanguinea. As we did not have an expert with us your guess is as good as ours. As usual on this trip we also saw many Pt aff nana. C reptans ssp reptans were everywhere we walked. In bud we saw C macrostylis, flava & falcata, Leptoceras menziesii & Lyperanthus serratus. On behalf of the group I would like to thank Sherry & Barry for their hospitality and the time they took to show us around. Also many thanks to Chris French for leading us on Saturday. About 2.30 pm. the weekend "orchid trip" ended. I hope everyone returned safely home and enjoyed themselves as much as I

TALK ON DRAKEA BY GARY BROCKMAN AND PARACALEANA BY **CHRIS FRENCH**

Gary Brockman showed slides of all the currently known Drakea species. He referred to the early checkered history of Drakea elastica, which was named by John Lindley originally, and later by Richard Rogers as Drakea jeanensis. The later name is no longer used. Along the track someone transposed the two. For some time it caused confusion because the endangered D elastica was common whereas D jeanensis was prolific. The confusion has now been rectified. Gary showed slides illustrating the slight variations within some Drakea species. Chris French also used slides to illustrate his talk on Paracaleana species. He showed several slides of P triens complex including the one that grows on Sullivan Rock in the moss in November. He also showed P lyonsii and suggested looking for it on the south side of spinifex clumps. Referring to Horts duck its very close as to who found it first, Fred Hort or Gary Brockman.
