The MEGA-Prasophyllums of Western Australia

Thanks to Mike Duncan for this item and picture, which appeared in the ANOS Victoria Bulletin, February 2006.

As the orchid season wanes in south-east Australia and largely retreats to the alpine areas, it's still in full swing in Western Australia. With more than 370 recognised species in the south-west land division, and a flowering period largely restricted to the August-December period, there are plenty of spectacular orchids still to see in late November. In particular, there are many late flowering *Caladenia*, *Diuris*, *Prasophyllum* and *Thelymitra* species. In 2005, I spent nine amazing days studying some of the more beautiful, bizarre and enormous orchids WA has to offer.

In late spring, while the diminutive, 10-15 cm spikes of the Fragrant Leek Orchid (*P. suaveolens*) flowers in Victoria, there are some giant *Prasophyllum* species in flower in WA. The Christmas Leek Orchid, (*P. brownii*), the Swamp Leek Orchid (*P. drummondii*), the King Leek Orchid (*P. regium*), and even the Fringed Leek Orchid (*P. fimbria*) are all in flower. The average plant of each of these species is comfortably greater than 1 m, and in the case of *P. regium*, the average plant is about 1.5 m tall – it's not the 'king' of the leek orchids for nothing All are easily larger than Victoria's biggest *Prasophyllum*, the (not so) Tall Leek Orchid (*P. elatum*).

As evidence, I offer this picture taken near Bridgetown. In a burnt swamp, I was soon surrounded by a forest of enormous *Prasophyllum* spikes, before being confronted by a huge *P. regium* plant of more than 2 m. Now, it's not very often that I have to look up to anything (some would say that's due to my generally poor attitude and lack of respect, but that's another story), but for the first time ever I encountered an orchid that was taller than myself. I'm easily taller than 1.9 in my

boots, and my hand is reaching up to the top of the spike. My estimation is that it was a massive 2.1 m tall!

CALADENIA HUEGELII REPORT

Jeff Spencer has provided an extract from the Summer 2006 edition of the CALM publication EcoplanNEWS, in which it is reported that a search for Caladenia huegelii (Grand Spider Orchid) in October 2005 had discovered a population numbering 246 plants near the Harvey Estuary.

The find makes this population the third largest known.

FIELD TRIP REPORT - SW TOUR by Wayne

Merritt & Rob Halls 27/28 Dec 2005

This tour started in the banksia woodland on the Bunbury/Capel Rd where many T Fuscolutea were

found including one stand of 12 plants. Also discovered were many hundreds of Cryptostylis Ovata. The journey went onto the Bridgetown/Manjimup Rd where, in a winter wet heathland, the vaiety included M. Media/Media and Brownii, Caladenias Serotina and Radiata plus hybrids, E Emarginata and Pras. Brownii. Further along at Lake Muir were D Drummondii and a very late M. Orbicularis. The next sites were on Denbarker Rd and while C Ultima was not found in flower (only one finished specimen), in a swampy area burnt the previous summer, were more D Drummondii, Pras Gibbosum and Macrostachyum, M Familiaris and T. Tigrina. From here we ventured further south to Walpole. Windy Harbour Rd and via Muir Hwy back to Margaret River.

The variety included C Corynephora, Epiblema Grandiflorum, T Caniculata, M Pulchella and of special note on the Muir Hwy near Nyanup was Para Brockmanii that had some lovely doubleheaders.

Bird spotting was an added highlight that included Emu wrens, Red Winged wrens and a Southern Boobook owl.

CONSERVATION AT MOORA

On Sunday 2nd April 8 members of the club met with a group of people at Moora to initiate action about conserving a bush area on the Midlands road near the town boundary. Club members, led by Stuart Harris, showed locals the locations of a range of orchids that will flower in July/August including C Exilis sb Vanleeuwenii (Moora Spider). The group is seeking Shire approval for this site to be conserved. Local councillor Jim Pond, also something of an orchid enthusiast was on hand to lend active support. Local conservation enthusiast Marie Carter led the group to some other areas of interest, including the bush block over the road from her own home. Marie is seeking to have these areas preserved as well. Eddy Wajon was able to provide important advice to the Moora group about how to proceed with funding applications. This will enable fencing and signs to be erected to protect the areas from vehicle damage. A field trip will be planned to Moora to this site and others including some that Jim Pond mentioned. Marie even organised lunch for the

group. This rounded out a productive and enjoyable day.

FIELD TRIP REPORT:

Wayne Merritt reported on a trip with Rob Halls to the south west in late December and early January just gone. This report is found on Pg 3

GENERAL BUSINESS:

- 1. Group Librarian, Bill Burton, advised of two new volumes in the library - The cultivation of Australian terrestrial orchids, and the draft 2nd edition of Paracaleana sp, by Brown and Brockman.
- 2. Eddy Wajon reported on the recent opening of Roe Highway externsion 7. The study and translocation of Caladenia huegelii is continuing. Among the positive outcomes of the collaboration are the reduction in the area cleared (6 19 hectares depending on calculations used); all unused road reservations handed to the Conservation Estate; lot 161 Forrest Road vested in the Conservation Estate; use of wire rope barriers to reduce the separation to significant bush reducing the clearing required. There was general recognition at the opening ceremonies of the value of conservation of flora.
- 3. Tom Blinco reports on a proposal to restore parts of the Zigzag railway, which would impact on the flora of the route, and recommends WANOSCG monitor the proposal.

Guest Presentation: Noel Clarke presented a photographic comparison of South Australian orchids, comparing respective species of Western Australian orchids.

RAFFLE DRAW: The raffle, donated by Tom Blinco, was drawn by the Speaker, Noel Clarke, and won by the President, Mike Harper.

NEXT MEETING DATE: The next general meeting will be held on 19 April 2006.
