Speaker for WANOSCG May 17th Meeting

Title: 'Orchid Conservation after Eastern Australia's 2020 Megafires'.

Dr Ryan Phillips – La Trobe University

Ryan Phillips did his PhD at UWA/Kings Park and Botanic Gardens but is now a Senior Lecturer in ecology at La Trobe University in Melbourne. His primary area of research is the ecology, evolution and conservation of species with specialised biotic interactions.

In particular, his research has sought to understand the role of pollinators and mycorrhiza in plant species rarity, and the processes underpinning plant diversification and floral evolution.

His research has a particular focus on the Orchidaceae, including projects in southwestern and south-eastern Australia.

Together with the Royal Botanic Gardens Victoria, he has developed projects on preventing extinction in bushfire affected orchids, and optimising reintroductions of rare species based on knowledge of pollination biology.

Orchid Hub Project - An Orchid Conservation Solution?

Over the past few months, members of the WANOSCG Management Committee have been liaising with Orchids Western Australia (OWA) regarding an innovative orchid conservation project to see if there is a role for WANOSCG and its members.

OWA is made up of various orchid societies and clubs across WA and is working with Dr Kingsley Dixon in the development of the project. The Orchid Hub Project (OHP) is aiming to develop community capacity to propagate our terrestrial native orchids with the view of using the propagated orchids to replenish orchid stocks in bushland.

The project is built on a transitioning science to practice capacity approach. The science of propagating Australia's somewhat fickle terrestrial orchids has made significant advances in recent times and appears to be at the stage where, with the right equipment and training, it could be able to be done in community-based nurseries.

The Orchid Hub Project plans to set up three community-based orchid propagation hubs at key locations in southwest WA to progress this approach. The equipment and project management will not come cheaply but there has already been considerable interest in the project from other organizations.

Central to this interest, and the key to the project going forward, is the involvement of Lotterywest WA. When hearing of the concept, Lotterywest showed enthusiasm for the approach and requested a funding submission, which they are currently assessing. A response is expected over the next 3-4 months.

We are aware that some of our members already know of the project and are keen to be involved. However, in our discussions with OWA, some issues have been identified that will need to be addressed before we believe the project can be successfully implemented.

WANOSCG will continue to fully assess the project and is awaiting further information and progress, particularly funding from Lotterywest, but will keep members informed of any developments.

1. Ravensthorpe Area; June:

2. Hyden Area; July/Aug:

Mel again has offered to organise a trip to see the *Thelymitra speciosa* and *maculata* around the Hyden area. Dates to be confirmed for both trips once numbers of interested participants are known. Register with possible dates suiting your attendance.

3. Diuris ID Field Trips x 4:

John Ewing has done a great job at setting up a Field Trip and Educational moment for those wishing to identify the *Diuris* genus.

I have attached a separate article detailing the four trips he has proposed. Again, dates to be confirmed for both trips once numbers of interested participants are known.

4. End of Year Trip:

Andrew Brown has suggested we have an End of Year Trip to the Albany and Walpole areas on Saturday 2nd and Sunday 3rd December. Please add the dates to your diaries.

The suggested plan is:

- a. Meet at Bakers Junction Reserve at 11 am on the Saturday morning and search the burn.
- b. Stay in the Walpole area that night (just over an hour and a half's drive) and meet for dinner at the Pub.
- c. Sunday, meet north of Walpole on Thompson Road in the morning and spend several hours in the burn area. More detail and accommodation options will be supplied closer to the date.

Potential Day Field Trips and Field Trip Leaders (FTL) Needed:

Noel Clarke Memorial Field Trips:

We still have an opportunity for more field trips using the information from some of Noel Clarke's records and information and we are looking for people to lead a number of small trips to be organised retracing his treks in memory of him and to see if the interesting range of orchids found at those sites are still there. The area to be covered will be:

- 1.1. Shires of York, Beverley, and Brookton
- 1.2. Can be held in the months of August/September/October with more than one trip possible here
- 1.3. Details of the area with GPS data, etc. will be supplied to the Field Trip Leader.

Diuris ID Field Trip with John Ewing

There are a total 53 *Diuris* species noted in recent WA Field Guides. There are 31 species in the *corymbosa* complex, 20 in the *laxiflora* complex and two in the *laevis* complex. John Ewing is proposing to lead four main field trips and some supplementary Perth region trips to enable members who wish to learn more about identifying each of the *Diuris* species.

The field trips are designed mostly for newer members, but anyone who would like to join in is invited to come. Depending on who and how many sign up, e.g., if some can only come on weekends and not midweek, depending on the weather, the proposed times and places for trips are:

- 1. Late July (3rd week) 1-day trip to Moora, including a couple of side roads
- 2. Early September (2nd week) 3-day trip up as far as Kalbarri this will mean two overnights
- 3. Late September (4th week) 2-day trip to Augusta and returning via the wheatbelt one overnight
- 4. Mid-October (2nd or 3rd week) 3-day trip via Albany and a winding route home two overnights.

All dates to be confirmed one month before actual trip once interested party numbers are verified.

The Field Trip Leader will assume that participants have read and studied the three documents listed below that will be supplied upon registration:

- Diuris of WA ID
- Diuris corymbosa key by species features
- Diuris laxiflora key by species features
- Field Data Sheet to record information gathered.

These documents will be provided to participants along with instructions on the day about how to fill in the data sheet. Dependant on numbers, all participants will work in pairs or threes and, for each population of each species seen, they will then analyse the data measured. From this they should be able to conclude which species it is and be able to discuss with others why that is their conclusion.

While other species of orchids are sure to be seen on the trips, the focus will be on *Diuris* ID. In addition, a few other *Diuris* species will not fit into our timetable and locations. However, altogether, it is expected that over 40 of the *Diuris* species will be seen, studied and identified.
